Participation by Design (10/27/23)

Presenter: Grace Dearborn, Author, Mentor, International Keynote Speaker on Education

In this interactive and entertaining training K-12 educators will learn how to increase student participation in class discussions, turn-and-talk, group work, and homework. A dozen techniques for designing better peer and group structures will be presented, practiced, and modeled. Take away specific, concrete strategies for putting reluctant learners firmly, but gently, on the hook for participating in the learning.



Building Classroom Community through Class Circles & Restorative Practices (11/9/23)

A positive class culture can have a profound impact on learning. Creating this environment takes intention and on-going reflection and practice. In this session, teachers will learn both "the why" and "the how" of conducting class circles and implementing restorative practices where students are viewed as partners and owners of their classroom, learning, and community.

Discussions will center on topics such as the emotional intelligence of an educator and the importance of dismantling the "color blind" approach.



Second Semester Reboot (2/6/24)

The second semester is an ideal time to revisit expectations, the class culture you want to foster and take preventative measures before Spring fever disrupts your classroom. In this session, teachers will reflect and learn actionable steps to create a class culture to support students' academic and social-emotional learning through Morning Meetings. Additionally, teachers will learn how to implement mindfulness as a form of self-care for themselves and their students.



How to Become a More Culturally Responsive Educator (Part II): Dismantling Systems & Practices (2/28/24)

This session will build on the concepts, ideas, and strategies from session 1. Participants will dig deeper into understanding the practices, policies and systems that contribute to lower achievement and success for students of color. Participants will understand how to align equity focused practices with the current CSTPs. They will also understand unconscious bias and the importance of an inside/out approach as an equity focused educator.
